

(To Include The start of Our Very Own, Lake Hopatcong Elks!)

In an age before jets, air conditioning and super highways, Lake Hopatcong was a major northeast resort. Within easy reach of large cities to the east, the lake's size and setting at over 900 feet above sea level made it a perfect summer destination. Boasting over 40 hotels, two amusement parks, and all types of entertainment, Lake Hopatcong welcomed thousands each year, including leaders in government, industry and entertainment. In the heart of this summer destination was Mount Arlington, formed as a result of the tourist boom to be the governing body for the lake's largest hotel. The new Borough hosted a wide assortment of hotels, entertainment venues, a golf course and in the early 1900's became the home of Bertrand Island Park.




14TH ANNUAL LEAP IN THE LAKE

Are you ready to be a part of an amazing 3-day experience at our Wildwood State Convention that's filled with fun in the sun, laughter, incredible food & drinks, bonding with your fellow Elks, families and friends and a huge amount of Lake Hopatcong Elk Pride? This year is sure to be an exciting one as we are once again defending our 1st Place Governors Trophy and looking to bring it home for the 4th year in a row! If you want to be a part of this incredible weekend, please get your \$140 deposit in TODAY.

Our Wildwood 2024 package will include a 2-night hotel stay (check in Friday; check out Sunday), hospitality room all weekend with unlimited draft beer, wine, soda, water & liquor, BBQ on Friday night, continental breakfast on Saturday and Sunday, and a Pig Roast on Saturday night.
