In an age before jets, air conditioning and super highways, Lake Hopatcong was a major northeast resort. Within easy reach of large cities to the east, the lake's size and setting at over 900 feet above sea level made it a perfect summer destination. Boasting over 40 hotels, two amusement parks, and all types of entertainment, Lake Hopatcong welcomed thousands each year, including leaders in government, industry and entertainment. In the heart of this summer destination was Mount Arlington, formed as a result of the tourist boom to be the governing body for the lake's largest hotel. The new Borough hosted a wide assortment of hotels, entertainment venues, a golf course and in the early 1900's became the home of Bertrand Island Park.
