Your Lodge can and should apply for the various grants to assist your communities: Beacon Grant, Gratitude Grant, Spotlight Grant, Promise Grant, Impact Grant, and Freedom Grant. Each grant has a specific deadline to apply for funding. I encourage all Lodges to take the time to educate yourselves about these grant programs. Find some Members who would be willing to dedicate their time to apply for these worthy grants.

Other programs ENF funds include: Scholarships, Youth Activities, Veterans Service, Elks Veterans Memorial maintenance, and much more. It is very important to let our Members know about the great work ENF does. A fine way of “Promoting Elkdome With Enthusiasm” is to support the Great Heart of Elkdome. The Elks' mission is to build stronger communities and ENF provides the resources to fulfill this mission. I charge you to get out into your communities with great pride and show them what the Elks do for them. Another important program we must focus our attention on is Red Ribbon Week. This is the nation's oldest and largest drug prevention program. The staggering number that comes to mind is that in the United States alone, there have been nearly 71,000 overdose deaths each year. The Elks will always be there to support hugs are better than drugs. I can't think of any better way of “Promoting Elkdome With Enthusiasm” than to work hard to stop these dreaded drug diseases.

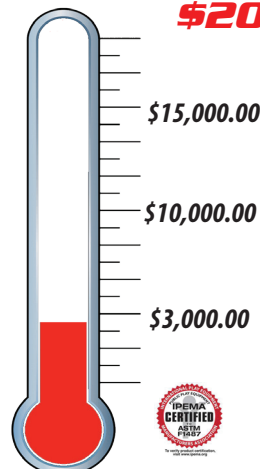

Applicants will be judged on scholarship, leadership, and financial need. Ranging from \$1,000 per year to \$12,500 per year, Most Valuable Student scholarships are for students pursuing a four-year degree, on a full-time basis (minimum of 12 semester hours), in a U.S. college or university. Applications for the 2023 contest are available online at Elks.org. The 2023 MVS application deadline is November 14, 2022.

Also our Elks National Foundation Legacy Awards - Legacy Awards are \$4000 (\$1000yr/4 years) scholarships for the children and grandchildren (step child or step grandchild) of Elks members. 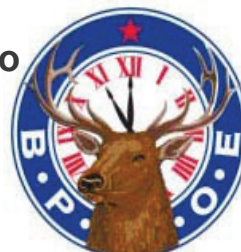

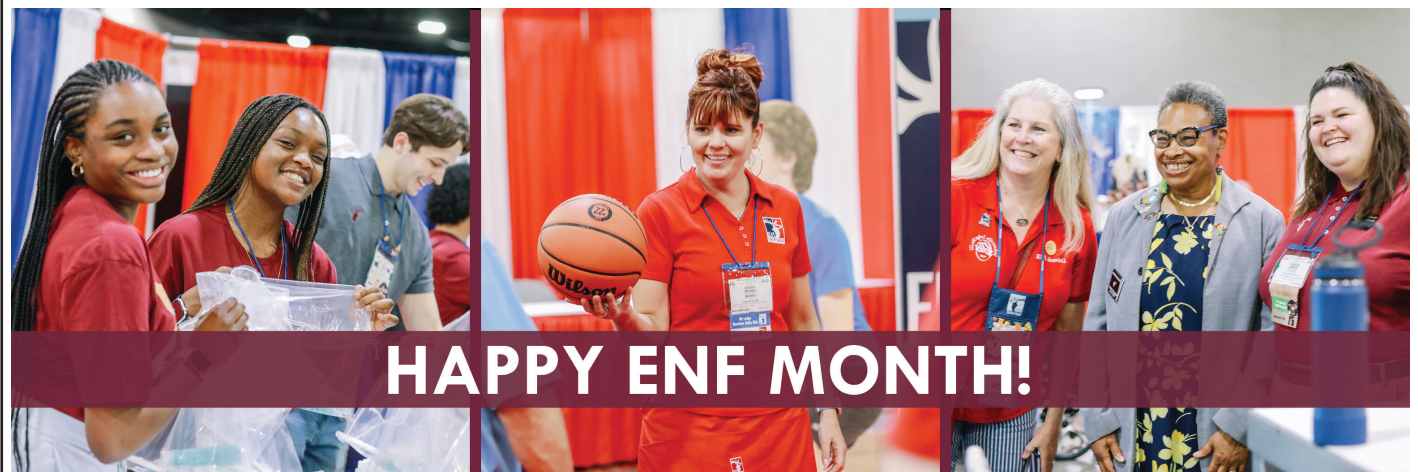
