Another important program we must focus our attention on is Red Ribbon Week. This is our nation's oldest and largest drug prevention program, held annually from October 23-31.



Eulogy for Madelyn Walrod, PER

Friends, family, and fellow Elks,

Today we come together with broken hearts to remember and celebrate the life of Madelyn Walrod, Past Exalted Ruler of Lake Hopatcong Elks #782.

Madelyn's Elk journey began on March 2, 2003, when she was initiated into our Lodge, sponsored by the late Jan Walsh, PER. From that very first day, she was all in. She wasn't the kind of person to sit back and watch. She jumped right into service — first on the House Committee, learning from House Chair Linda Gathen, PDD, and then taking the reins herself. For 13 years, Madelyn was the heart of our House Committee.

She also advanced through the Officer Chairs, and in April 2011, was elected Exalted Ruler. Along the way she helped bring our Lodge to new heights — State Championships, and yes, being part of the 2011 National Championship team in Phoenix, Arizona. That same year, as ER, she guided her team to a proud Final Four finish in Austin, Texas.

But as impressive as that is, Madelyn will not be remembered for trophies or titles. She'll be remembered for her heart.

At Christmas, she was always there — buying, wrapping, and delivering presents for underserved children. She worked tirelessly on food baskets for families in need, never letting anyone go without. She made sure our special children weren't just included, but truly loved and seen. And she never let us forget our Veterans — reminding us that their service must always be honored and their sacrifices never forgotten.

And it wasn't just programs. It was personal. Madelyn had a way of noticing people — especially the ones who felt unnoticed. If you were lonely, struggling, or just needed a shoulder to cry on, she was there. With advice, with comfort, or with that classic Madelyn bluntness that somehow always came with love. She could make you laugh even in your darkest moment, and sometimes, that was exactly what you needed.

Now let's be honest — Madelyn also knew how to have fun. She loved to gamble, she loved the sun, and if there was a chance to work on her tan, she was gone quicker than you could say, "Who's cooking tonight?" If she wasn't working at the Lodge, she was living life — fully, loudly, and with no apologies. That was Madelyn.

She poured herself into this Lodge. She helped build our reputation — great food, great drinks, great people. If you ever left hungry or thirsty when Madelyn was around, well, that was your own fault! And if you didn't leave with a smile, she'd probably tell you to lighten up, grab a plate, and try again.

If you were a Lake Hopatcong Elk, Madelyn was part of your foundation. If you were a New Jersey Elk, you knew her from conventions, from events, from her way of making new friends everywhere she went. She didn't just represent our Lodge — she embodied what it meant to be an Elk: charitable, giving, and always there for others.

Her 22 years of membership were more than service — they were a gift. A gift of her time, her talents, her humor, and most of all, her heart.

Yes, today we cry. And we should. Because we have lost someone irreplaceable. But Madelyn would be the first to tell us not to sit here too long in sadness. She'd say, "Order a drink. Grab a plate. And if you're feeling lucky — let's find the nearest casino."

Madelyn, rest in peace. You gave us your love, your laughter, and your loyalty. You made this Lodge stronger, this community better, and our lives richer. We will miss you more than words can say, but your spirit will live on in every child's smile at Christmas, every veteran we honor, and every laugh we share together.

God bless you, Madelyn.

You were one of a kind. And you will never be forgotten.
