

Changes Proposed Changes to Lodge Bylaws, from Lodge Secretary Barbara Tokar, PER

We will be voting on the following changes to our Lodge Bylaws at the regularly scheduled Lodge Meeting on November 21st. If approved, they would go into effect on April 1st, 2024.

ARTICLE II-A: ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. The Governing Body of the Home, Club or other facility as designated in Article IX can grant Associate Memberships to Members in good standing in other Lodges solely for the use of the Lodge's social facilities upon such terms as it may prescribe.

We are voting to Accept Associate Memberships from Members in Good Standing at other Lodges for an Annual Dues of \$15, for Soley the use of our social facilities.

ARTICLE IV: MEETINGS

Section 2. We are voting to have the regular hour of our Lodge meeting be 7:00 PM; but at any time, however, the regular meeting may be held at an hour to be determined by vote of the Lodge to that effect at the previous meeting, provided that written notice of such change of meeting hour shall be given to all the Members.

ARTICLE IX: CLUB OPERATIONS AND MANAGEMENT

Section 1. The operation, management and control of the Home, Club or other facility owned and/or occupied by this Lodge shall be supervised and conducted by:

ARTICLE X: FEES AND DUES


