


SICKNESS & DISTRESS

NJSEA Policy Statement on the Legalization of Marijuana

The New Jersey state Elks Association is concerned by the recent legalization of marijuana for recreational purposes in New Jersey and other states.

Our organization has always been a strong advocate against the use of drugs. Despite the legalization of marijuana, our position has not changed.

The misuse of drugs and alcohol has taken a great toll on our country and in particular our youth. The numbers of overdose and drug-related deaths in our country and specifically in New Jersey are unacceptable. Too many young people's lives have been lost or ruined as a result of drugs here in New Jersey and across our country.

Therefore, the Elks still stand against the use of drugs for any purposes other than as may be properly prescribed by a physician for legitimate medical purposes.

In addition, the Elks are a patriotic organization and our members have sworn to uphold the Constitution and laws of the United States of America.

Federal Law still classifies marijuana as a Schedule 1 controlled substance. Under Federal Law it is a crime to possess, cultivate, or use a Schedule 1 Controlled substance.

Therefore, it is our position that legalization of marijuana by the State for, either medical or recreational use does not change the fact that, the use of marijuana is against Federal Law.

Our Drug Awareness program's message to our nation's youth remains, 'no illicit drugs ever', and 'no alcohol use under the legal age.'

Our organization remains dedicated to helping our youth make healthy decisions for themselves and others and to help them avoid the dangers and consequences related to the use of drugs and alcohol.
